TCS SEPTEMBER REMINDERS

ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

Our first bus arrives at approximately 7:50am and the building is locked until 7:45am. We ask your cooperation in not dropping students off prior to this time as there is no supervisor outside for them.

SCHOOL REGISTRATION FORMS

Your child took home a registration form for you to edit. Please check the form carefully. Please make any necessary changes, or indicate that everything remains the same. It is important that we have up-to-date contact information in case of an emergency. It is very important we receive all forms back by September 15th. Thank you for assisting us to have this important information up-to-date.

PARENTAL CONCERN

Questions or concerns pertaining to a student or issue within a school should try to be resolved with the appropriate teacher and/or Principal. If the issue is not resolved at the school, there is a Parental Concern Referral Form (Formal Request for a Referral). These forms are available on the CCRSB website.

PRIMARY VISION SCREENING

The majority of primary students have had their eyes checked (Enhanced Vision Screening) by the Public Health Nurse during the spring primary registration. Any child in grade primary who missed the vision screening will be assessed by the Public Health Nurse in the upcoming months. The results of the screening tests will be sent home with the child. If you do not want your child to have the vision screening, please contact Public Health at (902)752-5151



SIP-STUDENT INSURANCE PROGRAM

The ABC's of Student Accident Insurance: My child has been injured at school. How do I make a claim? Go to sip.ca and click on the red apple.

- Claims for dental expenses can be made by completing the Student Accident Insurance Dental Form in its entirety
- Claims for medical expenses can be made by completing the Student Accident Insurance Non-Dental Form in its entirety
- Parents must report an accident within 30 days to the insurance company

MEDICAL CONSENT

School employees cannot administer any type of medication (prescription or non-prescription) to a student without a consent form signed by a parent or guardian. Medication must be in the original container. The printout from the drug store must accompany the medication. These forms are available at the office.

VOLUNTEERING

Parent Volunteers are a very important part of school life. Please complete a volunteer form if you are willing to volunteer or help out in any way—reading with students, coaching, chaperoning, school trips, gardening, etc. All school volunteers are required to complete a criminal record check and child abuse registry. Forms pertaining to Volunteering have been sent home.

COMMUNICATION PLANS

Each of our teachers will provide a written Communication Plan outlining their expectations and assessment/evaluation methods. This will explain how each teacher will communicate with parents during the school year regarding student progress.

INFORMATION FOR STUDENT BIKERS

If your child bikes to school, a permission form needs to be completed. Please request a form through your child's teacher.

It is important that the students observe good safety practices as responsible bikers.

1. Wear a helmet
2. Be alert
3. Avoid schoolyard traffic

During dismissal, biking students are expected to remain in the front lobby until all buses leave from the school property. This is to prevent bikers from interfering with the safe departure of vehicles and to ensure the biker's own safety. Students who do not follow this safety practice will not be permitted to bring their bike to school. It is not recommended that lower elementary students bike to school.
